Sanborn averaged 19.6 points and 14.1 rebounds this season for the Quakers while leading them to the Division III Final Four. He notched 22 double-doubles and was a first-team Old Dominion Athletic Conference selection, as well as the league's Most Valuable Player.

"Tyler had a breakout year on the national scene and proved he was the top post player in the country," said *DIII News* editor Gary Rubin, "There were many candidates for this award, but at the end of the day we felt Tyler was the most deserving."
