DePauw University head coach Kris Huffman has been named the 2007 Molten/*Women's DIII News* Coach of the Year.

Huffman led her Tigers to a 31-3 mark that included the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference and NCAA tournament titles. DePauw closed the season on an 11-game win streak after downing Washington for the 2007 national crown.

"Kris did a great job in leading her team to the highest level of success — a national title," said *WDIIN* Editor Gary Rubin. "Reaching 30-plus wins is also a true accomplishment so she is most deserving of this award."

Huffman, the 2002 *WDIIN* Coach of the Year, will receive the coveted Molten Gold Trophy Ball to recognize her achievement.
